


AIDSVu is a compilation of interactive online maps that display HIV prevalence data at the national, state and local levels, allowing users to filter by different demographics, including age, race and sex. The maps pinpoint areas of the country where the rates of people living with an HIV diagnosis are the highest, allowing us to better understand where the needs for prevention, testing and treatment services are the most urgent. **AIDSVu** also offers users HIV testing and HIV treatment locators. **AIDSVu** is presented by the Rollins School of Public Health at Emory University in partnership with Gilead Sciences, Inc.

PERSONS LIVING WITH AN HIV OR AIDS DIAGNOSIS, 2010

MORE THAN 1.1 MILLION PEOPLE IN THE UNITED STATES ARE LIVING WITH HIV INFECTION, AND ALMOST 1 IN 6 (15.8%) ARE UNAWARE OF THEIR INFECTION. FIND YOUR LOCAL TESTING SITE AT AIDSVU.ORG/TESTING
