

Social Determinants of Health and HIV Among American Indians/Alaska Natives



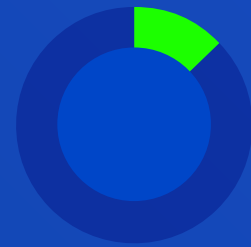
From 2018 to 2019, **new HIV diagnoses** among American Indians/Alaska Natives **increased by 11%.***

Social determinants of health such as **poverty, lack of health insurance, education, and unemployment,** can **negatively affect HIV-related health outcomes** for **American Indians/Alaska Natives.**

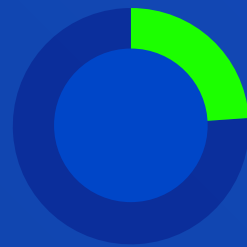

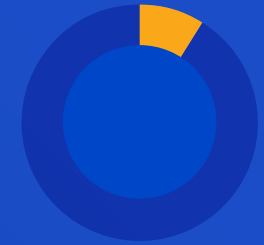

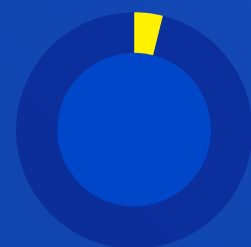

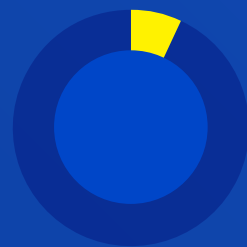

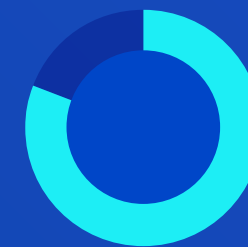


88.3%
