Social Determinants of Health and HIV Among Asians, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders

In 2020, Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander people represented 2.3% of all new HIV diagnoses in the U.S. Social determinants of health such as poverty, lack of health insurance, education, and unemployment can negatively impact HIV-related health outcomes for Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander people.
