Among the U.S. Population



Social determinants of health such as **poverty**, **insurance**, **education**, **household income**, **food insecurity**, and **unemployment** can negatively affect HIV-related health outcomes.



Poverty

12.6% of the U.S. population were living in poverty

Insurance

10.3% of the U.S. population (under age 65) were uninsured

88.9% of the U.S. population had at least a high school education

The median household income for the U.S. population was **\$69,021**

The U.S. has a Gini Coefficient of **0.482** which is a measure of income inequality
